Clinical Excellence and Quality Improvement

Guiding the quality improvement initiative for the Group – 8 Apollo Hospitals have been accredited by Joint Commission International (JCI), USA, the largest by a private hospital group in the region

Apollo Clinical Excellence (ACE)

ACE is a balanced clinical scorecard which was launched in 2009 as ACE@25 and incorporates 25 clinical parameters. ACE @25 has undergone four revisions and during the last revision in 2023, it was renamed as ACE@40 and now it incorporates 40 clinical parameters which are benchmarked against the world's best published outcomes. For example, the CABG survival figures are bench marked with Cleveland Clinic (99.5%). ACE@25 was published as a case study by the Ivey School of Business, Canada. ACE 3.0, a new version of ACE, implemented in September 2024, incorporates 35 parameters that includes 5 process related parameters.

The Apollo Standards of Clinical Care (TASCC)

TASCC was implemented across all Apollo Hospitals in April 2012. It encompasses six initiatives - Clinical balanced scorecards, ACE 1 and ACE 2, Apollo Quality Program (AQP), Apollo Mortality Review (AMR), Apollo Incident Reporting System (AIRS) and Apollo Critical Policies Plans and Procedures (ACPPP). The TASCC monthly scorecard comprises of the scores for each of these initiatives plotted as a hexagon. The target each month, for every hospital, is to achieve the perfect hexagon.

TASCC was revised in 2018 and thereafter upgraded in 2022 to include eight initiatives - Clinical balanced scorecards, ACE@40 and ACE 2, Apollo Quality Program (AQP), Apollo Mortality Review (AMR), Discharge summary compliance, Clinical Governance / Apollo Learning Together, ICU Checklist and Safe Surgery Checklist.

Apollo Quality Program (AQP)

To bring uniformity in the quality of care across the hospitals, the Apollo Quality Program was initiated in 2012. The Apollo Quality Program includes implementation of standardized methodology for Clinical Handovers, International Patient Safety Goals, Surgical Care Improvement and Zero Medication Errors. Revised in 2022, the AQP includes Effective Communication, International Patient Safety Goals, Surgical Care Improvement, Medication Management and Blood Transfusion Safety and Medical Records Compliance.

Measured as a dashboard of 20 parameters, it has resulted in improvement in patient safety processes across Apollo Hospitals. It has been published in the official journal of the International Hospitals Federation as well as the Journal of Patient Safety and Risk Management. AQP has been presented at various prestigious international forums such as the ISQUA and the Hospital Management Awards (HMA).

Apollo Mortality Review (AMR)

The mortality review in all Apollo Hospitals has been standardized with trigger criteria, checklists and peer review processes. A structured review of deaths (not just 'unexpected' deaths) helps detect quality issues that would otherwise remain hidden, particularly around every day processes of care.

The Apollo Quarterly Clinical Audit (AQCA)

An unannounced Clinical Audit Program-The Apollo Quarterly Clinical Audit (AQCA) was launched in October 2022 to help understand whether systems and protocols are working on the ground and also help identify errors/fallacies within the captured data. AQCA auditors team comprising of 25 auditors (all doctors) are conducting the audit of all 16 programs covered under Apollo Clinical Excellence Success Score (ACESS). AQCA audit findings are shared with the COQR team for discussion with the concerned Medical Heads during the monthly review meetings. Necessary input and guidance are given to the respective Medical Heads which helps in resolving the issues identified.

Apollo Quality and Innovation Awards

Conceptualized the annual Apollo Innovation and Quality awards.

The aim of these awards is to promote excellence through sharing innovative practices in clinical services, finance, operations, environment, community service and human resources across the Group.

Apollo Clinical Awards

This platform felicitates and rewards group consultants for their contributions and achievements.
